The practice identified

Dorset have created a video which is an interview with a previous NQSW who decided to undertake the final piece of reflection for ASYE as a presentation. The video describes the process, why the NQSW decided to undertake the presentation route and the benefits in terms of their learning.

Element(s) of the NEC/NEC+ to which the example relates

A1. Feedback is proactively sought through mechanisms such as the 360 evaluation tool. NQSWs are active participants, rather than passive recipients.

By producing the video Dorset are hearing directly from an NQSW about their experience of the process from which they can learn.
